The Kandkari Craft is a rare medieval Kashmiri art tradition being promoted extensively by Sedr Heritage.

Kandkari is the engraving technique used to hand-craft exquisite copperware in the Kashmir Valley. The traditional designs ethched into the copperware include local motifs such as the Chinar leaf, Mehrab and the Lotus flower.

Known for its extensive health benefits, copper has been used to make kitchen and tableware for centuries in India, as well Central Asia including Turkey and Persia.
